## WHAT IS NEW LIFE TRUST

New Life Trust is an Australian based Charitable Trust that works for the direct relief of poverty and suffering of children. Our Myanmar Project currently provides relief for orphans and abandoned children.

# OUR MYANMAR PROJECT

New Life Foundation effectively started in 1992, when Rev Zaw Hlaing, a local Pastor in Yangon and his wife Bella, took in 3 orphans who were dropped at their door.

Sadly, Zaw Hlaing, passed away aged 54 in 2004. However, his vision for rescuing children lives on through his wife Bella and her children, and a dedicated team of volunteer carers, cooks and maintenance workers.

For the past 2 decades New Life Foundation has rapidly grown. They have overcome many struggles and events and today home over 180 orphans and abandoned children, have a rice farm and fish paddy that provide additional food for them, as well as a medical centre to provide healthcare for them and the wider community. Their next project is to build a Education and Training Centre.

## **NLF EDUCATION TRAINING CENTRE**

Our Goal over the next three years is to prepare our children with improved education and training in order to improve employment opportunities. We will do this by:

- Establishing a preschool for local community children
- Teaching English and Burmese literacy to children
- Teaching basic and advanced computing skills
- Building a modern and safe building in which to learn
- Establish an English and Burmese library.

# MYANMAR

## MYANMAR HISTORY

Up until 1948 Burma was ruled by the British, until they gained independence. However, a military junta has been ruling the country and the country has been on a stead economic decline. Even though the military junta lost the election to Nobel Peace Prize winner, Aung San Suu Kyi in 1990, they refused to give up power. Myanmar is currently inviting foreign investment to assist rapid economic growth.

However, human development is at a historic low, with less than \$1 per person being spent on healthcare. The underfunded sanitation and water treatment contributes to many food and waterborne diseases such as hepatitis, diarrhea, malaria, dengue fever and typhoid fever. The World Health Organization has ranked Myanmar's health system as 190th out of 190 in the world. That is last place in the world,

# FACTS

One third of all children in Burma have malnutrition and many die from hunger or preventable diseases.

80% of the population live on less than \$2 a day, this is barely enough to cover essential food items.

building methods, as well as provide knowledge and work to local tradesman.

The second is as a education team. This team provides craft activities, English and music lessons, medical check-ups, some relief for staff and general activities to keep the children entertained for part of their school holidays.







Past projects include, building new leaders accommodation, repairing the girls dorm roof, concreting food areas, and many more. Their work is valuable to New Life Foundation, and is a great way for Australians to understand the Burmese way of life.
